# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Monuments, Markers, and Monitoring, Oh My!

I had an amazing experience this fall when I went along with Barb W. and other club members to do some of the annual corridor monitoring on two short sections of the AT. The AT "corridor" is the land owned by the National Park Service that extends a few hundred feet on either side of the trail. Corridor monitoring means walking along the border of this NPS land and the adjacent lands ( for example, privately owned lands, state game lands, municipalities) to assure that all boundary markers are in place and no encroachments have occurred. This involves leaving the AT treadway and bushwhacking over rocks and through dense vegetation to locate "monuments," i.e., the markers installed by surveyors years ago to establish a line between NPS lands and that of neighboring landowners. Encroachments, such as illegal dumping of waste, wood piles from forest clearing, rock piles, discarded machinery, or hunting blinds, are also documented. These discoveries are subsequently reported to the ATC and corrective action is taken, if needed. During the monitoring we also post signage along the boundary lines, indicating which areas belong to the NPS.

The process itself is not unlike a scavenger hunt, with a compass and a map to assist you. Our adventure on a sunny and brisk Sunday morning began with a short, easy road walk from the parking lot just off Rt. 309 east towards the tower. From there we headed through the woods for the boundary line and the first monument on our list, which was easily found with the help of clearly evident "witness trees" which triangulate the location of the monument. I would like to say that the rest of the day was as easy as that. However, the remaining 2-3 miles of our monitoring trip were significantly more challenging. Steep slopes, monstrous rocks, dead trees and blowdowns, missing witness trees, and fallen leaves covering everything slowed us to a crawl in many places. The pace was slow, but ultimately we located most of the markers, completed our evaluations, and headed back to the "real" trail to return to our cars via the AT itself. Never did the rocky treadway of the AT seem so comforting and pleasant as it did after being off-trail for so long!

My overwhelming reaction after this experience was a deep admiration for the many AHC



members who for years have diligently served the AT community and our club by monitoring the borders of our 10.3 mile section of the trail every year. Several of our people are actively involved each year, and each monitors about 4-5 miles, on average. Some have been doing their sections for upwards of 20 years! A sincere thank-you to those who have faithfully volunteered in this capacity for so long! Because of your hard work and dedication, the Allentown Hiking Club is well respected among its peers in the Appalachian Trail Conservancy for completing our monitoring duties on time and *in toto* each year.

So as the new year begins, I want to commend all those on whom I rely continually for the smooth operation of the club: the chairpersons of all of the committees, the hike leaders, and all the trail volunteers. The new year will bring old and new challenges. There will be weeds to whack along the trail, trash to pick up, invasive plants to pull, overgrowth to cut back, repairs to the trail and shelters, and sometimes it will seem as though our work is never done. But each time we meet a long distance hiker on "our" section of the AT, and they tell us how much they appreciate how well we tend the trail, we'll know why we commit ourselves to this noble task. With this I wish you a wonderful winter hiking season, and a fascinating and adventurous New Year!

The general public is invited to join us on hikes and other events. If a club or organization wishes to include one of our hikes as a formal activity on its schedule, we ask that it contact the leader in advance for permission. Times listed are departure times; please arrive at least 15 minutes before the listed time. Starting times are strictly observed and appropriate clothing and sturdy shoes/boots should be worn at all times.

Generally, our pace is moderate with opportunities for resting and sightseeing. Every attempt is made to assist and encourage hikers, but we cannot be responsible for their safety on the trail. Any rugged outdoor activity entails risk, and we expect all participants to rely on their own judgment and good sense to take care of themselves and know their limitations. Anyone under 18 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult. Hikers are expected not to lag too far behind the main party.

We car-pool as much as possible to save fuel. PASSENGERS PAY DRIVERS 10 CENTS PER MILE TO DEFRAY FUEL EXPENSE. Drivers, please remember to check your mileage and let the passengers know how much mileage reimbursement they owe you.

Meetings are held at 7:30 pm the first Wednesday of the month at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church, 140 South Ott Street, Allentown, Pa. Meetings include a discussion of the previous month's activities, as well as upcoming activities. Scheduling meetings are held quarterly for members to coordinate hikes/trips, etc. for the upcoming schedule. All members are invited and encouraged to schedule activities; we are a 100% volunteer organization, and it is up to members to keep the schedule filled.

#### **AHC HIKE RATING SYSTEM**

In an attempt to assist hikers, a hike rating system has been set up to allow the hiker to judge his/her ability to complete the hike. The rating system will precede the Allentown Hiking Club's usual hike description. On multi-day outings such as backpacks, the rating for the hike will reflect the distance traveled on a per-day basis. Remember that the hike ratings are assigned by the hike leader, and are therefore based on the leader's subjective opinion. The rating system is:

RATING	DESCRIPTION (distance,terrain,pace)
<b>A</b> +	Up to 7 miles, little climbing and easy terrain, 2 mph or slower
Α	Up to 7 miles, some climbing and/or rocky terrain, 2 mph or slower
<u>B</u> +	Up to 7 miles, some climbing and/or rocky terrain, 2 to 2.5 mph
В	7-10 miles, some climbing and easy terrain 2 to 2.5 mph
C+	7-10 miles, some climbing and/or rocky terrain, 2 to 2.5 mph
С	7-10 miles significant climbing and/or rocky terrain, 2 to 2.5 mph
D+	10-12 miles, some climbing and/or rocky terrain, 2 to 2.5 mph
D	10-12 miles, significant climbing and/or rocky terrain, 2 to 2.5 mph
<u>E</u> +	Over 12 miles, some climbing and/or rocky terrain, over 2.5 mph
